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SECTION 4: **First aid measures**

4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information: Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person, or never induce vomiting.

Inhalation: Remove exposed person to fresh air. In case of complaints, get medical advice.

Skin contact: Remove contaminated clothing. Wash skin with large amounts of water, use soap. In case of persistent irritation, contact a doctor.

Eye contact: Flush eyes with plenty of water for 10-15 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. In case of persistent irritation, contact a doctor.

Ingestion: Not possible under normal conditions. When happened, rinse mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting (aspiration hazard). Get medical attention.

Protection of first-aid person: It may be hazardous to the person providing aid to give mouth-to-mouth resuscitation.

4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

May cause drowsiness or dizziness.

Causes damage to organs through prolonged or repeated exposure (nervous system).

Inhalation of large amounts of vapor may cause respiratory irritation.

Propellant gas: In high concentrations, it has a suffocating effect, the lack of oxygen has fatal consequences.

4.3. Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Symptomatic treatment. Show safety data sheet or label to doctor.

SECTION 5: **Fire-fighting measures**

5.1. Extinguishing media

Suitable extinguishing media:

Foam, carbon dioxide, dry chemical powder, water fog (trained personnel only).

Unsuitable extinguishing media:

Full water jet. They could cause splattering, and spread the fire.

Simultaneous use of foam and water on the same surface is to be avoided as water destroys the foam.

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5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Hazardous combustion products:

In case of combustion carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, various hydrocarbons and soot can be formed.
